Spring is right around the corner and we are looking forward to the nicer weather. The Association has been busy with snowfalls lately but the crew is beginning to clean out the garages. Thank you to everyone that cleared out their parking spaces too. This makes it much easier for the staff to clean out the garages.

We are looking at replacing another batch of roofs this year. Product availability has greatly improved for building materials compared to last year. It was a struggle to get certain items ordered in a timely manner and selections were limited, this year inventories have improved for roofing products. We are getting bids for roofs now and we will notify owners with approximate estimates and timelines as soon as we get the information together from the contractors. Buildings getting new roofs this year are buildings 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 37, 38 and 39.

It looks like the snow will melt away soon and we can begin preparing the various outdoor projects for summer. Questions always arise regarding planting outdoors. Owners are allowed to plant flowers in the common areas if they so choose. Before your start, please take a look at your rules first and understand there are limitations on what is placed on the grounds. Flowers are fine when planted in an appropriate place, but there are no appropriate places for personal items; statues, ornaments, pet tie outs, chairs, tools, buckets, totes, wind chimes, globes, butterflies, flags, solar lights, banners or signs of any kind on the grounds. Please don't take it personally, but if you purchase these items and place them in the common area you will be asked to remove them.

Reminder, paver blocks outside your porch in the common space are also limited to 4 feet by 6 feet. Do not exceed the size limit or you will be asked to remove them. When in doubt call the office for clarifications.
